





I would point out that, in contrast to most major brewers, Rayments/Greene King increase their prices only once each year and this year's increases have been fairly modest. Indeed, some items, including Mild, have not increased at all. Prices should now remain stable until the next Budget in the Spring and, hopefully, with the fall in inflation rate, increases may be less than in the past year or two. There have been few changes of Bar Staff in the last couple of years and it would be nice to see some new blood coming in. In particular we need persons willing to work weekend evenings on , say, a one in two or one in three basis. Anyone who is interested, please contact myself or any Committee Member.
