— Property Statement —

The name of Waltham is derived from the Saxon words a wood or forest, (hence the name Weald) and ham, a seat or house. The half hundred of Waltham formerly belonged entirely over nearly the whole County; the remaining portion is now commonly known as Epping Forest. The rich and fertile marshes in the Lee Valley lay in King Alfred's time under the grand streams of the Lee into several meanders; so that the Danish ships lay waterbound leaving their marines to shift for themselves overland. The Gunpowder Mills have existed for more than a century and half: and till they were purchased by the Government, belonged to Mr. Walton. "Farmer spec and completest works in Great Britain"

Before the Government occupied the Mills at Waltham, their principal establishment for the manufacture of gunpowder was at Faversham. This establishment is constructed buildings with due regard to additional security. In 1767 and 1781, explosions took place; the latter being very destructive to life and property and to the sufferers and an act was passed for the greater safety of Gunpowder Works, one provision of which was the removal of the Works into the more distant ones.

It is probable that the explosion in 1781 caused a reduction in the establishment and also the purchase of Waltham. For it is certain that negotiations were opened quarelled at Waltham Abbey "September 1787. Take on men lately employed by Mr. Walton: should the Government purchase the Mills they will be allowed all November 1787. Men arrived from Faversham Establishment not settled, and men to receive extra lodging allowance."

"13th December 1787. Powder makers to be hired for a month and labourers for a week as men will be sent from Faversham"

"29th December 1787. Storekeeper requested to give all particulars about land lately purchased from Mr. Walton as to rates, taxes, &c.

From this last extract it seems that the Mills were actually purchased in 1787 though the deeds are not dated till 1795. I found among the correspondence in the dated 27th October 1787 directing her to give up the keys thereof to Major Tongrove.

F298/3) is subject to the Lea Valley Drainage rate (amount not stated) payable in respect thereof and the following covenants and restrictions: W.D. to maintain the fences on the north side of the strip and on the north side of the occupation road and gates at the level crossing crossing marked (f) also gates at footpath at point marked (g) together with the crossing and footpath where crossed by the track of the railway and also to keep such gates securely fastened over the railway when not in actual use.

Vendor reserved all rights of light air etc, unrestricted right of way over the roadway at (f) and the occupation road. Right to retain flood channel at (h) and use same for running of water along same. Right to retain culvert at (e) and use same for pipes cables etc. Right to connect with the railway a siding shown "Proposed M.W.B. siding" and use free of charge the railway from such siding to the Great Eastern Railway sidings at Brundown station for the purpose of carrying not more than 2000 tons per annum of fuel. This right ceases however when the W.D. no longer maintain the railway in which event the vendors have the right of pre-emption on certain conditions.

63. The Conveyance dated 11th April 1917. (copy in I.F. F298/3) contains the following reservations and covenants.

Reservations by Vendor: (a) Right (subject to preferential right of W.D.) to use the Branch railway (for through traffic only and not as a siding) on such terms as to maintenance as may be agreed or failing agreement settled by arbitration.

(b) Right (subject to any necessary consent of Board of Trade or other authority) to construct in positions to be approved by W.D. such connections as in the opinion of W.D. may be necessary to enable the vendors to exercise the right (a) above. Covenants by W.D.:

1. W.D. to maintain in good repair and condition the level crossing at A, B & C.
2. To widen (if and when vendor desiring land is developed for building purposes) the level crossing B to width of 40 feet, if required by vendor and thereafter to maintain same to reasonable satisfaction of vendor.
3. To keep open and free from obstruction the courses (to allow of drainage) under the two arches at D.
4. To furnish to fence the land conveyed from vendor's land sufficient to withstand cattle and to maintain same in good repair and condition.

J. Martin Bridgman of West There is however a note in the aforesaid schedule against this entry that the site of the bed of the small River Lea is not, in T. Solis opinion, W.D. property file 119 Eastern 2878.

It is also noted that an area of land of 7 acres extent was exchanged with the E.C. Railway Co in 1837 for 5a. 1r 28p. which was later sold to Dyson on 24. 1. 1848 for £270. 18. 9

The original deed has not been examined.

2. On a plan of the site and waterways of Waltham provided by the War Dept a note appears that the W.D. pay a rent for the privilege of using this large cut from Millhead Stream to the River Lea Navigation the rent paid to the parish of Waltham The lock and half gate were built and are kept in repair by the W.D.

The section of the river mentioned is numbered 35 on the plan and according to the schedule of deeds the right to use and divert part of the small river Lea from Small Lea Bridge to Romney Marsh was the subject of an agreement dated 18. 1. 1812 under which the W.D. covenanted to keep and maintain a good fence to the adjoining land of Newell Compton and keep clear the bed of the stream and make up the bank by soil arising therefrom.

The original deed has not been examined.

The question of disposal of certain waterways no longer in use to the Establishment at Waltham is being considered by F5C2 on 4 Land 1764 on the suggestion of D.E and R.18. The position of ownership has to be clarified however and F5C2 are investigating.
