Possible threat to nursery industry, council told

OUD bangs from the E.R.D.E. Government works are causing damage to glasshouse structures at Waltham Abbey and could threaten the nursery industry in the area if they are not stopped.

And Waltham Abbey Council have been asked to step in to try to bring a halt to these explosions by the company of Messrs. R. P. Greenall at Avey Lane, Waltham Abbey.

At a council public health committee meeting members were reluctant to "take sides" in the issue, part from writing to the Government establishment started using the testing bay near Avey Lane. He said the noise had certainly not increased over that span of ment to see if anything could be done to lessen the bangs.
