

THREE firemen at the Government's top-secret Explosives Research and Development Establishment in Waltham Abbey were presented with silver axe awards last Wednesday for being the best students of a six-week

last Wednesday for being the best students of a six-week fire training course.

Firemen Mr. Louis Courtney. of 5, Gews Corner. Cheshunt, Mr. H. Hammonds, of Ongar, and Mr. Colin Brooks, of Bishop's Stortford, each received their chrome and wood engraved fireman's axe at ERDE from Mr. Bob Griffin, the chief fire officer in the London area. They were also presented with a trophy in the shape of a flame, symbolic of the fireman's duties.

The firemen attended a six-week training course at the Central Training Establishment at RAF Manston in Kent at different times. And each one proved to be the
