A spokesman for the Ministry of Defence said on Tuesday: "We can confirm that MoD police have investigated the source of pornographic material at the establishment. A man has been questioned and a report sent to the Director of Public Prosecutions.

He said: "I don't know when it was actually sent to the DPP but I shouldn't think there will be any decision for some time."

The spokesman refused to comment on unofficial reports which mentioned pornographic film shows going on inside the establishment, "I have not seen the police report," he commented.

Stories in the National Press at the weekend spoke of a possible security risk at the establishment because of the porn trade. But electricians employed at PERME would only have access to "the lowest grade of classified material," said a spokesman.
