Observation

In the foregoing report none of the Machinery has been considered which in 1826 was Estimated by Mr. Wilks at £2293. 8. 0 to repair decay and the dilapidation of 2 Years might make £2500 necessary at the present moment: the Waterwheels, Sluices &c being quite decayed and gone.
