They have likewise ordered the 50 Barrels of Sweepings to be delivered at Miss^{es} Walton's Magazine at Barking Creek and direct you to transmit an Acc^t. thereof to the Office that the Value may be demanded of them

I have also received their Commands to acquaint you that y^e Dimension of Miss^{es} Walton's Stones for making Powder are as follows Viz^t

The Runners or Lopers... 7 feet high & 19 Inches deep

The Bed Stone or Ledger... 7 feet 6 Inches over and 20 Inches deep

You are therefore to report if those Dimensions will answer the present purpose
