In Return to your Letter of 29<sup>th</sup> Ultio to the  
General & by him Communicated to the Board I am  
Commanded to Acquaint you that you are not to  
Worke up any more Powder Sweepings as Mess<sup>rs</sup>  
Walton have agreed to purchas the same as it is at 117  
Shillings p Barrel Containing 100 Net pounds each  
You are therefore Ordered to send up by the Powder  
Vessel all the said Powder Sweepings Consigned to Mess<sup>rs</sup>  
Thomas & Bouchier Walton, and cause it to be delivered  
at their Magazine at Barking Creeks Mouth to Mr.  
Hutchinson Strange their Storekeeper there, and require  
the weight thereof to the Board, that an Order may be  
made for payment of the Value. Inclosed, I send you Mess<sup>rs</sup>  
Waltons Order to their Storekeeper, Mr. Strange, to receive  
the Powder
