Whereas We are given to Understand by the Commissioners of Our Treasury that in pursuance of an Agreement made by Our Order and on Our behalf by Charles late Duke of Marlborough as Master General of Our Ordnance with Mr. Benjamin Price for Our Purchasing of him certain Powder Mills at or near Feversham in Our County of Kent for the Use and Service of Our Ordnance, proper Deeds of Conveyance of the said Premises to Us or to Our Use, have been prepared with the Approbation of Our Attorney and of Our Solicitor General and are ready to be executed by the said Benjamin Price and his Trustees upon Payment to be made to them of the Sum of Five thousand six hundred eighty two pounds one shilling and seven pence being the Money agreed by the said late Duke to be given by Us for the said Premises. Our Will and Pleasure is that you forthwith cause a Bill to be made forth in the Method of your Offices for the said Sum of Five thousand six hundred eighty two pounds one shilling and seven Pence payable to the said Benjamin Price. Which said Bill is to be assigned by you for Payment out of any Monies in the hands of the Treasurer of Our Ordnance, and to be inserted in the Estimates by you to be Presented to Parliament of the extraordinary Expence of Services performed by your Office for Land Service and not provided for by Parliament in this present year 1759

And for so doing this shall be to You and all others herein concerned a sufficient Warrant. Given at Our Court at Kemsington this 11th day of May 1759 in the 32^d Year of Our Reigns. —
