

On Her Majesty's Service

Application made by the Respective Officers of the Royal powder Mills at Waltham Abbey to the Inhabitants of the same place, assembled in Vestry 31 March 1789 for their determination what will be thought a reasonable allowance P. Annum for the following permission, to enable them in carrying on His Majesty's Service viz

For admitting a foot path from the Barrier Gate leading out of the Kings works across the Hoppit to the Island, being 250 f. in Length the same to be ruled off (at the Expence of Government) to prevent the Labourers from walking about the Hoppit as described by a Red Line adjoining Sketch at Letter A

For admitting about 3 feet Broad to be excavated on one side of the Ditch 21 feet in Length as at Letter B

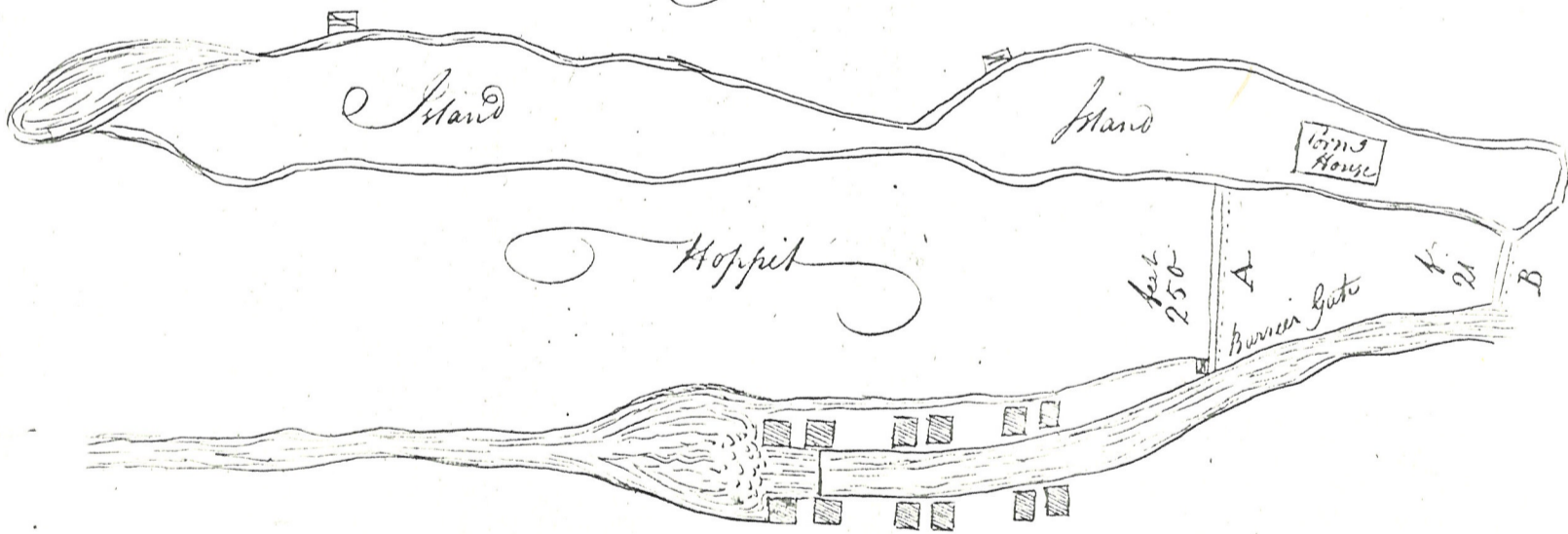
For admitting the Horses to pass to and from the Forging House, thro the Common Marsh

Also A Stable will be erected in the Island where the Forging House now stands

Also A footpath for the Men employ'd at the Refining House up to the Mill Tail also permission to put Bridges across the Ditch from the Island to the Hoppit for the Men to pass;

At a Vestry held in the parish of Waltham Abbey the 31st March 1789; the Inhabitants determined that £6.6.0 P. Annum was a Reasonable sum for permitting the several requests made by the Storekeeper on behalf of the Board of Ordnance; they say that Mr. Watson heretofore paid £5.5.0 P. Annum for the Liberty of Towing Barges from the Refining House to the Mill Tail - If the above proposition is accepted of they expect that the Rent shall commence from Michaelmas Last

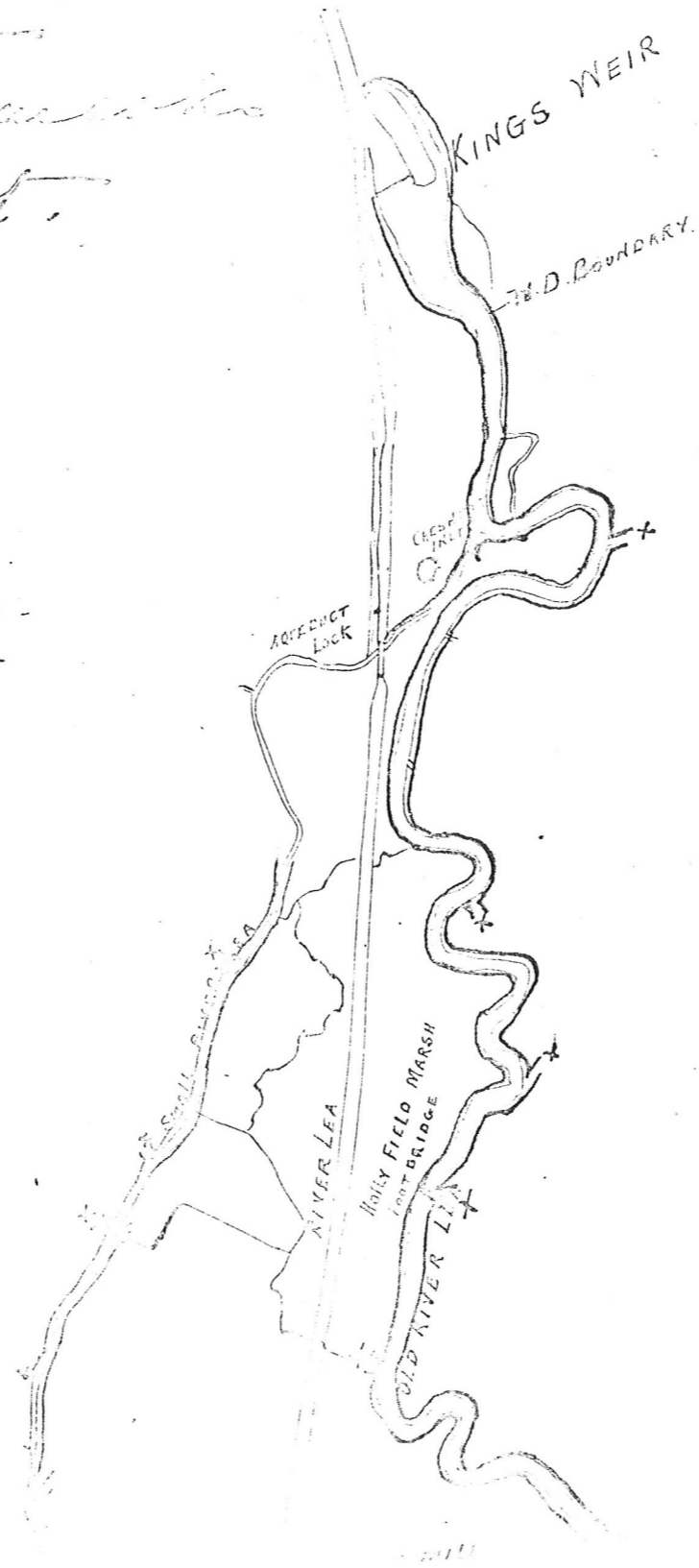

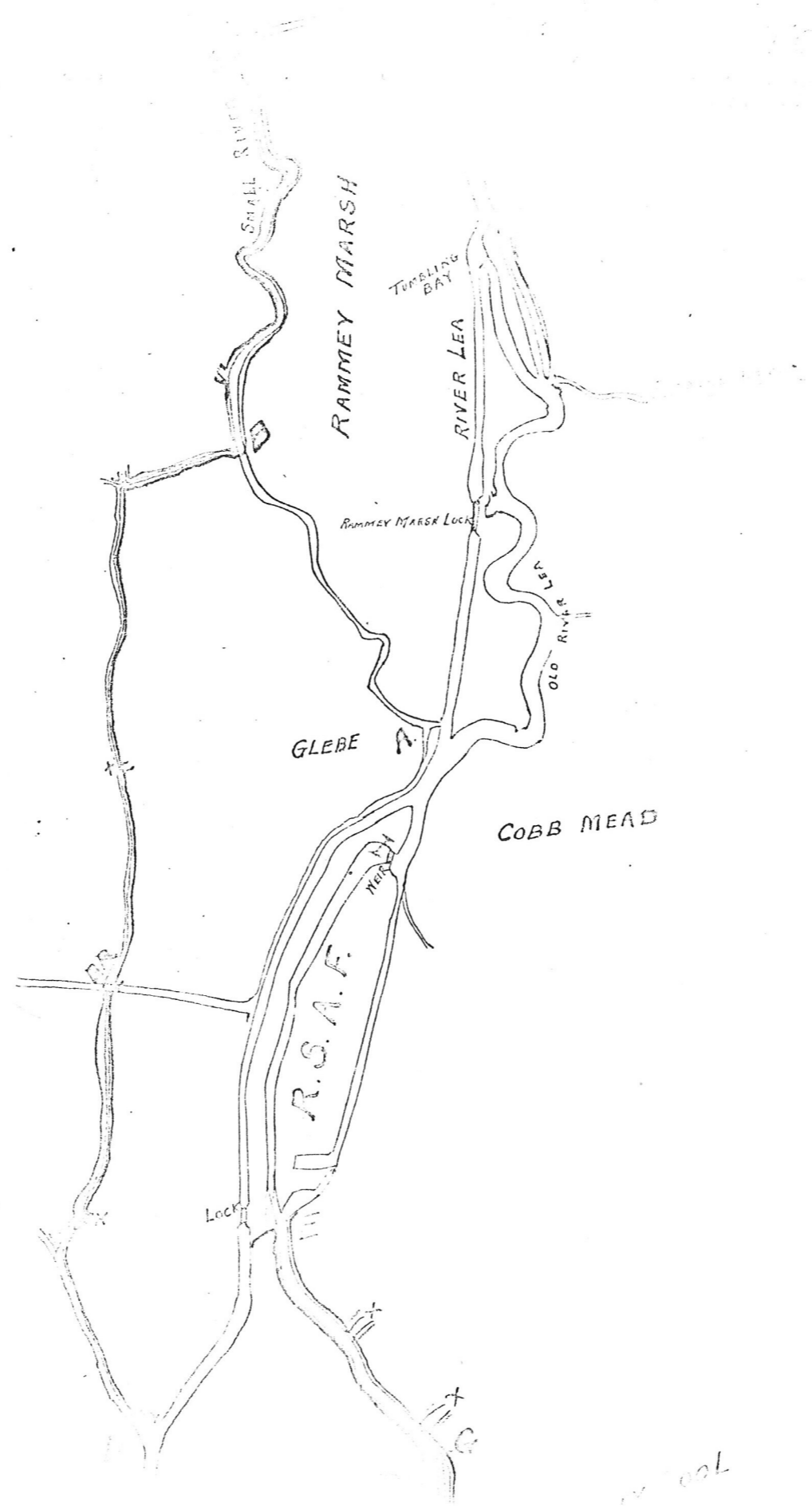

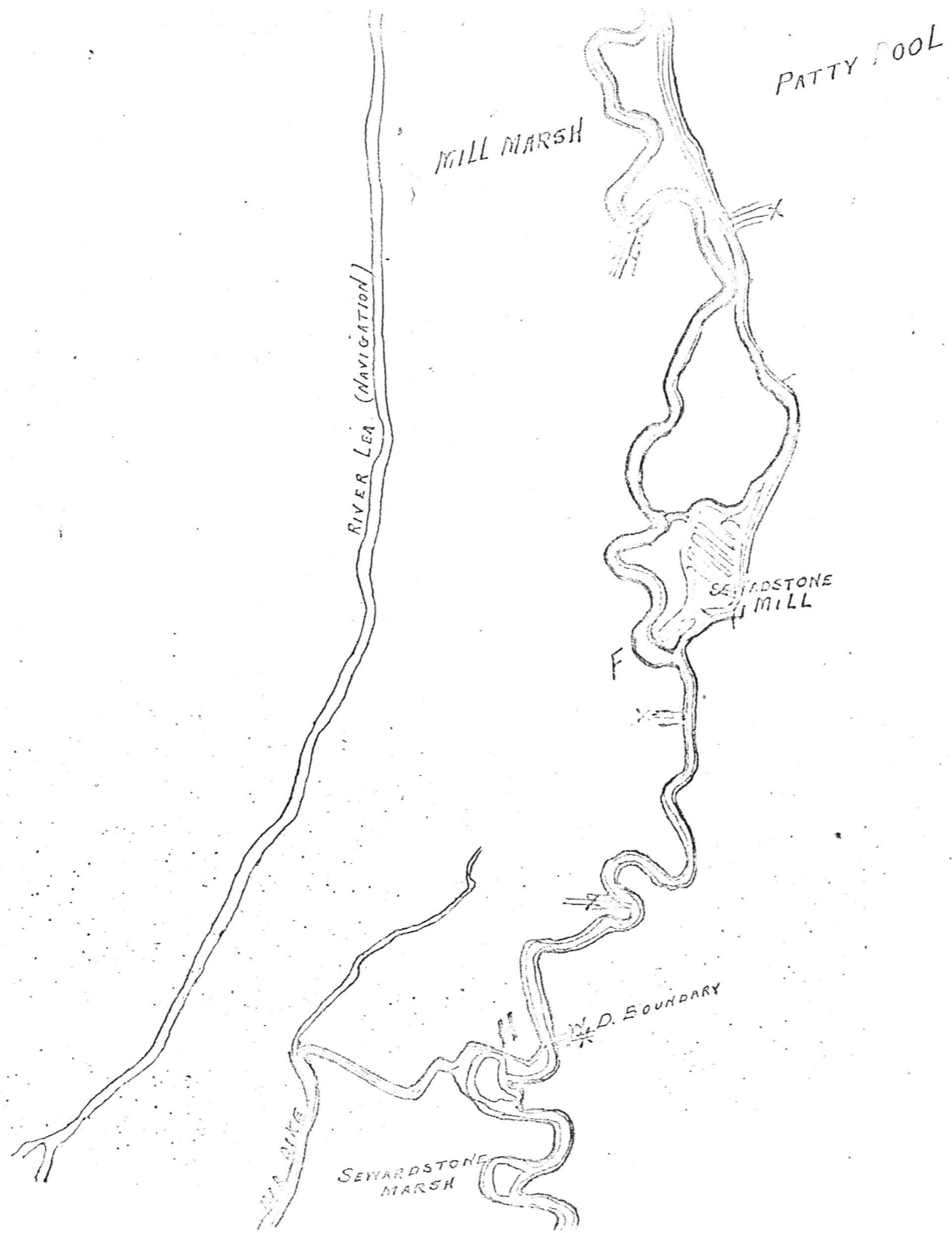
