Six pair of Runners & the other Branches of the
Manufactory.

We have taken the liberty of putting
up Hand Bills for Persons to give in Tenders, for
Supplying these Mills, with Two Able Draft Horses,
that we may be enabled to obtain them, on the
cheapest, best Terms, but don't mean to engage
them for any length of time until we receive
further directions thereon.

We shan't effect the Barge from
the Tower, with Brimstone, as soon as she arrives
we shall set the Mills to Work, agreeable to your Grace's
Command.
