My Lord Duke,

Agreeable to your Grace's Command of
the 2^d inst^o We beg leave to report, that the 12 Labourers
are arriv'd at this Place, from Faversham, which will
be sufficient (with the Men already here) for working
Six pair of Runners, & the other Branches of the
Manufactory.

We have taken the liberty of putting
up Head Bills, for Persons to give in Tenders, for
supplying these Mills, with Two Able Draft Horses,
that we may be enabled to obtain them, on the
cheapest, & best Terms, but don't mean to engage
them for any length of time until we receive
further directions thereon.

We shortly expect the Barge from
the Tower, with Primstone, as soon as she arriv's
we shall set the Mills to Work, agreeable to your Grace's
Command.
