It is nice to know that some-one still interested in the members of the old Lea Barge. I have contacted my elder sisters and they think the top left gentleman could be our father and does resemble him but they could not be sure.

As for the remainder we cannot give any true information, the only Mr. Weston I can recall was the Wallham Abbey Lock Keeper and that to my recollection was before 1920, they had uniforms similar to a Barge man.

The cap badges were not all the same if I remember correctly, the Barge Masters

I a slightly different one which
stated that they had a Master's Ticket
were Lightermen and Watermen of
River Thame. (which my father held)
uniform buttons were nickel plated
if I remember correctly, had the
letters G. R. ^{entitled} embossed in silver colour
e, these buttons were considered
to be very expensive in those days
cost 1/- each and around 1920 they
laced by the normal black bone
button. I am sorry I cannot be
more helpful to you
