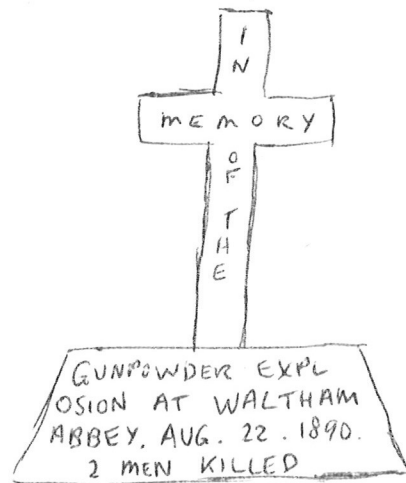


On Her Majesty's Service

WASC 1591

A small (untapped) hole has been bored in the center of the top of the base; or possibly is in connection with setting the cross into a socket in the top of the base.



1/2 size approx.

Bronze or brass.

Letters (all capitals) punched ~~separately~~ individually. Letters on base more worn than those on the cross.

Owner: Mr. Alan Wenborn, (Wenborn)

Dug up in garden at the above address (one of a row of five "cottage houses") when preparing to lay concrete for the base of a shed "a few days ago". Retained by Mr. Wenborn.

Found in association with pieces of colored and willow pattern china - possibly a rubbish-heap at some time.
