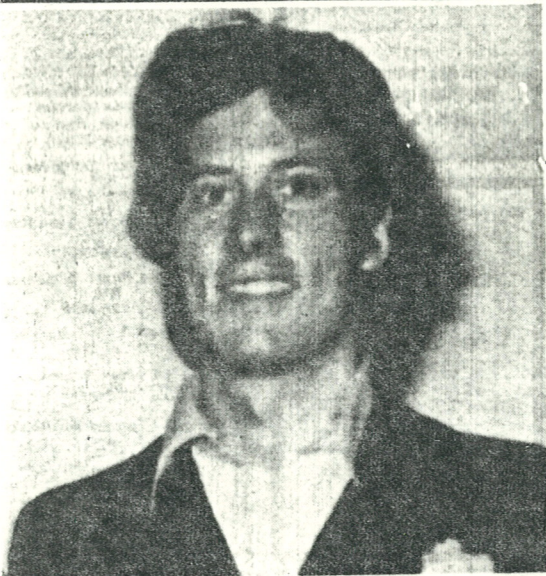

A YOUNG Waltham Abbey man who was planning to marry in August died following an accident on his motorcycle last week.

Vincent East (22), of St Clement's Court, died while undergoing an emergency operation at the North Middlesex Hospital in the early hours of last Thursday morning.

Now Chingford Police are appealing for witnesses to the accident which took place just before 9pm at Sewardstone Road, Waltham Abbey. It appears that Vincent's motorcycle collided with a lamp-post.

His mother, Mrs Vera Slade, has been warden to the elderly residents at St Clement's since it opened seven years ago. Vincent was engaged to Vicky Buckley from Tottenham.

He was made redundant last October from his job as an engineer at Thorne's in North London, the firm he joined as an apprentice after leaving Latymer Grammar School in Edmonton.

Motorcycles were his pride and joy," said his mother, "He was an experienced rider who had had motorbikes since he was 15.

"This was a big bike — 750cc — but he had a 900cc one before it was stolen. In fact he was buying a trials bike and would have got one this weekend."

Vincent also enjoyed sports like badminton and was a keen golfer.

He has three sisters, Pauline, Vivienne and Gillian, and a brother, Russell.

The funeral was yesterday (Thursday) at Waltham Abbey followed by cremation at Enfield.

Scientist who won international fame

INTERNATIONALLY acclaimed scientist and author Dr Lionel Bellamy CBE, of The Lodge, Powder Mill Lane, Waltham Abbey, died last week after a short illness. He was 65.

Dr Bellamy, once listed as the seventh most quoted scientist author in the world, worked as a director for PERME in Waltham Abbey until his retirement five years ago.

He had travelled all over the world lecturing on infrared spectroscopy, and published two books on the subject. Even after he retired, Dr Bellamy continued to go to the USA each year to run a scientific summer school.

He was also a visiting professor in Chemistry for the Universities of East Anglia and Leicester, and was due to have been in Oslo this week on a lecture tour.

Born in Clapham, Dr Bellamy moved to Loughton in 1952 and to Waltham Abbey

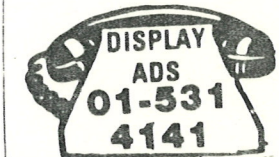
dead in lake

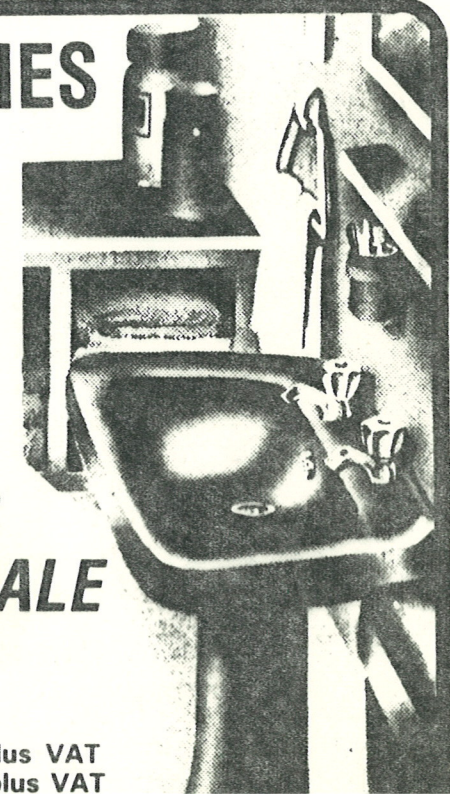

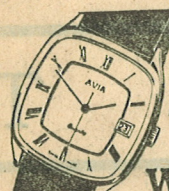

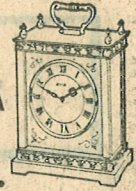
