With public transport services deteriorating and the service between Walthan Abbey and Harlow virtually impossible, every effort must be made to preserve what little health services we have left.

A further case for concern is the ever worsening incidence of flooding and/ or undermining in parts of

Stoneyshots, Rosebank, Eastbrook Road and Broomstick Hall Road, not unconnected one would imagine, with the development over the years north of Honey Lane and with the construction

of the M25.
The correction and eventual eradication of this problem is the direct responsibility of the Thames Water Authority, who should do something about it, rather than just hoping it will go away, because it will not.

It is good to see the new hotel now well under way at the Honey Lane-M25 intersection. This will be a great asset to the town and one advantage of the M25. which nobody wants on their own doorstep, but which is not entirely bad for Waltham Abbey.
