Regulations of
Grand Junction
Canal Co. relating
to carriage of explosives

Ref.: RAIL 830 / 50

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The Committee had under consideration the subject of Bye Laws for regulating the Conveyance, Loading and Unloading of Gunpowder and other Explosives on the Canal of the Company as required by the Explosives Act 1875.

The following regulations were agreed to as applicable to gunpowder and other Explosives passing over the Canal on Toll, and arrangements were made to have them published in the Newspapers in the manner prescribed by the Act with a view to their being confirmed by the Board of Trade.

Note.— "Explosives" are divided for the purposes of the Act (by an Order in Council, dated the 5th day of August, 1875), into seven Classes, as follows, viz:—

- Class 1.— Gunpowder.
- Class 2.— Nitrate Mixture.
- Class 3.— Nitro Compound.
- Class 4.— Chlorate Mixture.
- Class 5.— Fulminate.
- Class 6.— Ammunition.
- Class 7.— Firework.

1. No Boat shall load or unload Gunpowder or other Explosives, or move or stop with Gunpowder

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or other explosive on board at any
of the Company's Stations, Wharves,
or Warehouses, used for the conduct
of their ordinary carrying business.

2. The Master of any Boat convey-
-ing Gunpowder or other explosive
must always be present when
Gunpowder or any other explosive
is taken on board at the loading
place and when the same is
unloaded at its destination. The
hatches must not be removed
unless the Master of the Boat is
present to superintend the
unloading of the Cargo. Slippers
or shoes without nails or tips of
any kind shall be worn by the
crew of the Boat during the
process of loading and unloading
the cargo. And the crew
shall not carry about their
clothing any fuses or matches
or other combustible.

3. No other goods or cargo of
any kind shall be carried by
any Boat having Gunpowder
or other explosive on board.

4. Every Boat used for the
conveyance of Gunpowder or
other explosive shall be provided
with a close deck. All

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exposed form in the stowage space of the Boat must be covered with sheet lead, or in some other manner that shall be approved by one of the Inspectors under the Explosives Act, 1875; and double bulkheads lined with some non-combustible material shall be placed at each end of the hold where the Gunpowder is stowed.

The fire place to be placed not less than 6 inches from the bulkhead of the hold, and the woodwork near the fireplace must be lined or covered with lead or copper. The Boat to be painted outside with a red stripe along the gunwale not less than 6 inches broad.

5. Boats carrying Gunpowder or other explosive are to be carefully examined at frequent intervals by the Steerer, to ascertain that all iron knees, bolts, nails, &c., are covered with sheet lead, or other suitable material, and that there is nothing in the Boats likely to endanger the safety of the cargo.

swept and washed out before loading and after unloading. When carrying Gunpowder, the floor of the Boat is to be covered with raw hides or tarpaulin, on which the barrels are to be laid; the barrels are also to be covered with raw hides or tarpaulin.

7. No person shall be allowed to smoke on board any boat carrying Gunpowder or other explosive.

8. No fires or lights are under any circumstances to be permitted on board any Boat during the loading or unloading of Gunpowder or other explosive, or while lying alongside (or within a quarter of a mile) of any Magazine, or when the hatches are open.

9. No person having the care or management of any Boat containing Gunpowder or other explosive, and no person on board such Boat shall bring, have, or use, or permit anyone to bring, have, or use, any Charcoal, lucifer matches, or other explosive matter, during the time of loading or unloading, or when the hatches

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are open.

10. The hatches when closed, when gunpowder or other explosive is on board, shall be covered with tarpaulin properly battened down, and they must not be opened, except for loading or unloading cargo.

11. Loading and unloading of gunpowder or other explosive must always be performed in daylight.

12. No boat with gunpowder or other explosive on board shall be left at any time without two men at least being on board to take care of the boat and cargo.

13. Safety matches of a description only, which shall have been approved by one of the inspectors under the Explosives Act, 1875, shall be kept or used on board any boat carrying gunpowder or other explosive.

14. No person having the care or charge of a boat containing gunpowder or any other explosive

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shall, after beginning to load or
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at any wharf or quay, or other
place of loading, nor shall allow
anytime to be spent in loading
or unloading, beyond what with
all due diligence may be reason-
ably necessary, not exceeding
in any case 18 hours, unless
hindered by weather.

15. Gunpowder shall in all
cases be packed and marked
in accordance with the General
Rules contained in section 33
of the Explosives Act, 1875, and
other explosives shall be packed
and marked in accordance
with the General Rules as altered
by the Secretary of State in
pursuance of section 40, Sub-
section 3 of the said Act.

16. No person having the care
or charge of any boat carrying
gunpowder or other explosive,
shall receive on board, any
barrels, boxes, or packages, which
are damaged, broken, or in any
respect imperfect.

17. Any boat carrying gunpowder
or other explosive shall proceed
to her destination without any delay

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18. No Boat shall at any one time carry more than 500 barrels of Gunpowder, or 50,000 lbs. in weight if carried in other packages or its equivalent in any other explosive.

19. Boats when loaded with Gunpowder or other explosive shall not travel on the Canal in tow of a Steam Tug of any kind, but must be hauled by horses.

20. Boats having Gunpowder or other explosive on board, are to be legged through Blisworth and Braunston Tunnels, and are not to be permitted to pass through the Tunnels whilst the Tugs are proceeding in the opposite direction.

21. Boats having Gunpowder or other explosive on board shall travel singly, and must by no means pair with, accompany, or butt any other Boat.

22. Every Boat carrying Gunpowder or other explosive shall exhibit a Red Flag, not less than 2 feet square.

23. In the event of a breach of

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any of these Bye-Laws, by any
person in charge of or on board
of any Boat conveying Gunpowder
or any other Explosive, the said
Boat shall be liable, with its
tackling, horses, and accoutrements,
c., to seizure by the Company,
and may be used for a period
of 48 hours for removal and sale
of the Gunpowder or other Explosive.

24. Copies of these Bye-Laws shall
be exhibited in conspicuous places
at the Wharves and Warehouses on
the line of Canal, and may be
obtained on application to the
Secretary of the Company.

25. In the event of any breach
(by any actor default) of any
of the above Bye-Laws, the
Gunpowder or other Explosive
in respect of which the breach
is committed may be forfeited
to the Company, and the person
guilty of such breach shall be
liable to a penalty not exceeding
£20, and £10 for each day during
which the offence continues.

26. The terms, expressions and
definitions contained in the said
Act and the order in Council of
5th August, 1875, shall be

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applicable to these Bye-Laws,
unless there be anything in the
subject or context repugnant
thereto.
