These are in JPEGS_1 & JPEGS_2 directories (folders).



Mills seem to have fleurished al Waltham for a considerable period for we see that at the Survey made in the Conquere's reign in a comparison between the state of Waltham then and in Eduard the Confessivereyn then one mill, new three, and five fisheries.

The earliest known receid relating to the Haltham. Whog Finder Mills induted 1560. It is of interest as showing that, even this early the poetry was of ansiderate extent and was engaged in producing gunpender for the English Jevernment. On the date named, and have sufficiently in reference to a tender Suteniebrizze, and talan, writes to film Thomworth at Haltham. Irom that day at any rate and dualities earlier the manufacture of gunpaceder on a large scale had been carried on continuously at Natham. Whoy.

Turmer in his History of Haltham gives a view of the factory as it was in 1755. From this view, it appears that there were then some twenty buildings. Of the factory Tairmer says:-

Near the Town, on one of these Rivers (i.e. on one of the branches of the Lea) are curious funpewder Mills, which supply the nation with great quantitier of gunpeuder being esteemed the largest and completest Works in Great Britain and are new the Reporty of Me John Walten, a gentleman of hincon hencur and integrity.

This John Halten was a relative of Branc Halten the angler.

In 1787 the factory was acquired by the Government from another member of the family, a later felin Walten. From that time to the present it has always been known as the hogal Gunpender Suctory. The surrounding lands were purchased in 1765. Upon becoming Crewn properly the factory was enlarged by the Board of Ordnance under whose management it fell.

At various times between \$15 and 1855 the Beard of Ordnance prarchased land and buildings adjacent to the factory both in the town of Waltham. Abbey and along the lanks of the Lea to the North of the Sactory, acquiring altegether about 140 acres. They purchased also the whole right of water of the River Low and all its branches from King's Heir in Vazeing


to the Black Ditch in Sewardstone, a length of five miles.


In 1853 the factory was capable of producing 1000 barrels of gunpewder and of stering 5,000 lens of sallpetre and sulphur.

In 1872 the production of guncetten was commenced in a manufacturing scale at Haltham

Mey. The original guncetten Juctory consisted mainly of old buildings which had formed a part of the salt petro refinery and which abutted on the principal street of the town. It was capable of turning out about 250 tens of guncetten a year. In 1885, 100 acres of land, kinewn as Quinten Hill were purchased by the Government and a new funcetten Jactery was creded there which started with in 1890. In 1890 Sir Trederick Mels Explosives Committee recommended a smokeloss powder for the British Service to which the name of Certite was given. The details of its manufacture were worked out in the Royal Arsenal, Weelwich, and its production was commenced at Waltham Abley in 1891. A Nitreglyceine Sactory was put up in Quinten Hill where the necessary buildings for making cordite were also creeted. Later, to meet the increased demands fractite, ewing to its having taken the place of gunpowder for propulsive purposes, a second nitraglycerine factory was built in the old portion of the factory and this started work in 1898. At the same time, the majorety of the houses formerly used for the manufacture of gunpowder were converted inte houses for the manufacture of cordite, the original cordite buildings being no longer suitable for the larger output required. In 1014-15 a considerable expansion of the factory tock place to meet the needs of the freat

Har for Cannon Cardita.
