5) The cartographic evidence suggests a number of rebuilding phases probably reusing the same foundations. Photographs in the Public Records Office, supply 5 863, taken in January 1941 shows the building with its superstructure and bay demolished. The photographs negatives 323-326 also show views of the Breaking down machines and the cast iron mill with the words "Taylor and Chall..." presumed to be Taylor and Challen of Birmingham.

The porch had a timber floor covered by leather fixed by copper nails part of which remains. The magazine was entered through a door with a cambered brick head. floor of the magazine was also timber supported on sub floor brick piers. The magazine has a brick vaulted hipped roof covered by slates.

The magazine was heated by steam pipes closeby the magazine and probably derived from the building was a cast iron steam trap 'No.3 trap syphonia Royles Limited'.

This mill site represents the best above ground remains of a gunpowder processing mill on the site powered by a centrally driven waterwheel.

The mill survives as brick foundations in English bond either side of a central wheel pit. The wheel was powered from Millhead Stream, the flow of water onto the wheel regulated by a metal curving sluice gate. A scar on the side of the wheel pit indicates that the wheel was 4m in diameter. To either side of the pit and within the adjacent mills are two slots that would have formerly housed the pit wheel. The remains indicate that the wheel was a low breast shot wheel. br: lh's

The mill to the south measures 18m in length and 7.3m in width. The revetment along Millhead Stream has been rebuilt in concrete and corrugated iron however the other three walls of the mill are in brick. On the mill platform are low concrete sill walls with vertical mounting bolts for a timber framed wall. Within the building are sandstone machine bases with vertical mounting bolts. Packed around these base is brick rubble perhaps indicating a cellared interior.

bulto. The mill north of the central pit measures 13.2m in length and 6.4m in width. Internally are sandstone machine bases and brick and slate rubble. All four sides of this mill are laid in brick in English Bond.

The Dusting House has latterly been protected by concrete traverse to the north and south and probably to the east also. The traverse to the north has battered walls it measures 7.3m x 3.07m and 4m in height. A narrow channel separated it from 159. The traverse to the south also has battered sides, it measures 5.9m x 2.8m with a height of 4.2m. A channel existed between it and 159 that was covered by timber decking. On the opposite side of the tailrace to the east of the mill is a concrete foundation 36.5m in length that may mark the site of a further traverse.

- A mill may be shown to have occupied this site from at least the early eighteenth century and archaeological excavations (see below) may suggest the late seventeenth century. In 1771 a mill to a design by the eminent eighteenth century engineer John Smeaton was erected on the site. Later documentary and cartographic evidence indicated that this mill was probably rebuilt.

This is the only gunpowder mill on the site that has been the subject of any previous archaeological investigation (see documentary references above). Two short excavation seasons in the early 1970s suggested that the bank on which the mills sit was created in the late seventeenth century. Three distinct buildings were identified on the site dating between the late seventeenth century and the mid-nineteenth century, along with minor modifications. The consolidation of the canal revetment from timber to brick was also noted.

The field remains consist of most of the eastern brick foundations of the mill, forming also the edge of the tailrace. Within this stretch of wall the central wheel pit is visible although rubble filled. Minor irregular scarps on the platform between the tailrace and Millhead stream are indicative of building remains close to the surface.

The potential for well preserved archaeological deposits in this area is high.

- 5) The lock controls access between the high level canal system Millhead stream RCHME 296 and the low level system RCHME 301. The date of its construction is coincidental with the building of the south site Guncotton Factory and may reflect the increased barge traffic between the two sites.

The lock chamber and entrances constructed from grey engineering brick, a date stone set into the chamber wall reads '1896-7'. The lock gates are wooden with iron fittings. The lock chamber could be sealed by vertical sluice boards north of the north gates, the vertical slots for the boards remain. The sides of the lock chamber are protected by vertical rubbing boards, access into the chamber was by means of a vertical metal ladders set into the chamber wall on the west and east sides. Around the top of the chamber are set four cannons barrel down to act as mooring bollards.

The lock was filled form the high level system Millhead Stream by the means of two inlet valves sliding vertically and controlled by a hand wheel on a vertical screw thread. This allowed water to be discharged through a pipe to the south of the lock gates to fill the chamber. A similar arrangement is present at the south end of the chamber to discharge water. In this case the pipe is inside the chamber and the outlet valve to the south of the gates. The cast iron valve gear has the following name cast into it 'FREDK BIRD & CO 11 GT CASTLE STREET REGENT ST LONDON'.
