## Powder boats

The boats used in the Mills varied in size but kept to two basic patterns. The first was pointed or ship—ended at both ends and the other swim or square-ended at both ends so that they did not need to be turned but could be towed or poled from either end by men. There is no evidence that horses were ever used; possibly the thought of a horse bolting with a boat containing sometimes sensitive cargo was not considered good H & S practice!

Both types were carvel-built in timber and most had barrel shaped roofs although some of the swim-ended craft were just hulls. All the craft used within the mills were built using phosphor bronze nails and fittings. The hull and the cabin framing were made of sturdy timbers but the roof cladding was of canvas covered light planking. The canvas was to prevent contamination of the cargo from foreign bodies and the light planking allowed explosive force to dissipate in the event of an accident. There is, however, no record of one of these boats exploding at Waltham Abbey.

Following historical practice, the term "powder boat" is used for the smaller "on-site" craft. "Powder barge" applies to the larger sailing craft used for longer distance transport.

The table below shows the so-far discovered details of the powder boats at Waltham Abbey. The records are held at the National Archives at Kew.
