Following a search at Guildhall Library of Gunmakers and Founders Company apprentices after 1800
I also found John HANSON son of John of Whitechapel Founder, apprenticed in 1830 to Thomas Potts, Gunmaker

In September 1837 I found Margaret Hanson widow of John Hanson applying to the Company for relief. So John must have died by September 1837 – I have not yet found his burial.
